

How do we integrate these concerns in a coherent way?


Multiple Approaches Needed

- Awareness of local conditions that could lead to violence and other social issues
- Increased behavioral health assessment & treatment skills
- Improved substance abuse assessment & treatment by paramedis
- Training in de-escalation, evasion and escape
- Awareness of cumulative stress through resiliency training.
